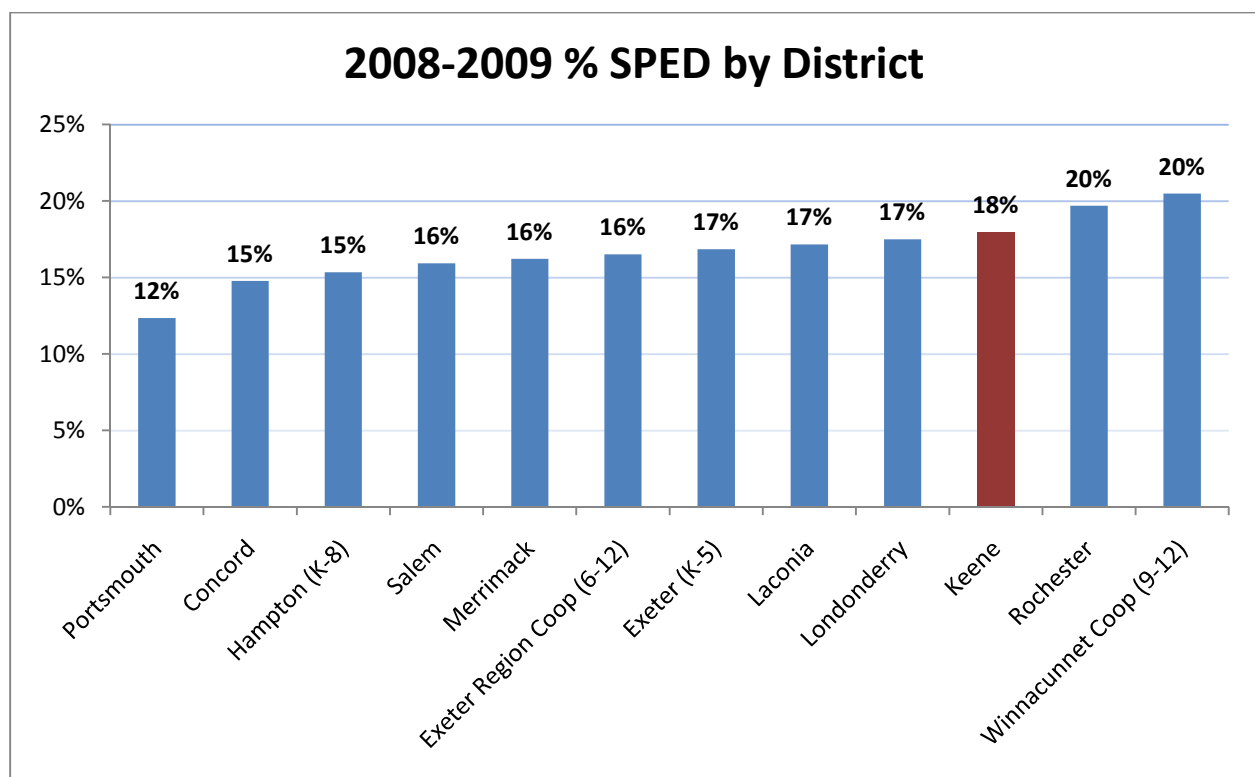


Corrections to Administrative Structure Task Force Report/February, 2010

The following corrections have been made to the report presented on December 15, 2009:

Percentage of Special Education by District

The original data from the Department of Education substantially over-reported Laconia's and Londonderry's special education percentages. The chart below contains the corrected numbers by district and reflects students with IEPs/district enrollment.



Enrollment Clarification

Enrollment numbers used in the report came from *NH DOE Students by Grade in NH Public Schools as of Oct 1, 2008*, but with preschool enrollments factored out for each district (e.g. for Keene, 3656 students minus 73 preschoolers for a total enrollment of 3583). Preschool enrollments were factored out because per pupil expenses are calculated only for K-12. Preschool staff was not included in any of the district staffing ratios.

However, in one appendix of the report (Administration Salaries by Elementary Size), the preschoolers should have been added back in and were not. The table should have been presented as below, with Wheelock showing 242 students rather than 169.

School Size Correction

Merrimack was listed incorrectly in the report as having small schools. In fact, Merrimack has three elementary schools (preK-4) each with an average of 512 students. Merrimack also has a grade 5-6 “upper elementary” school and a grade 7-8 junior high school.

Class Size

The class size policy has been updated to reflect the decision by the Keene Board of Education in December 2009 to limit grades K-3 to 20 students per class, while striving for 25 in grades 4 and 5.
