

The District will adopt, maintain and monitor an anti-idling plan that meets the provisions of the NH-CHPS program or its successor as managed by the NH State Department of Environmental Services. The Administration will develop written anti-idling guidelines and will meet with every employee who drives a district owned vehicle (buses, trucks, etc.) or operates district owned equipment (generators, tractors, etc.) to review said guidelines. New hires will be oriented on these guidelines. Managers for services contracted by the District will also be provided the guidelines to disseminate to their drivers, equipment operators, etc.
