Coordinated Approach to Child Health

The Recreation Center is collaborating with Keene State College to pilot an improved afterschool program for children ages 6-11 which encourages exercise and healthy eating behaviors. The new program will fuse the physical activity component of the CATCH program and incorporate vegetables harvested from the Recreation Center gardens into the nutritional curriculum of Keene State College's Early Sprouts program. Every day your child will participate in non or low competitive physical activities and learn good nutrition behavior choices.

The program is held every Monday through Friday from 3:30-5:30 from September 6 – the last day of school, currently June 19. The program is not held during school vacation, but there are other program options available at the Recreation Center. The program fee is \$175 for the school year for Keene residents and \$200 for non-residents payable upon registration. Space is limited.

Children may ride the bus from most Keene schools to the Recreation Center daily. Contact your school to make arrangements for the ride.

RECREATION CENTER HOURS

The Game Room and Gym are open to everyone 6 (six) years old and up for either a daily fee or with a season pass ID. Both rooms are adult supervised. The gym is open for shooting around or pick-up basketball. The game room has a TV, pool tables, ping-pong, foosball, nok-hockey, air hockey, and quiet board games.

ID cards must be renewed September 1. Purchase them at the Rec Center office from 8:30 AM to 5 PM Monday thru Friday. Cost for Keene residents is \$20, all ages. Non-residents cost is \$50 per person, all ages. IDs are valid through August 2012. No card? Daily fee is \$2 Keene residents and \$3 non-residents.

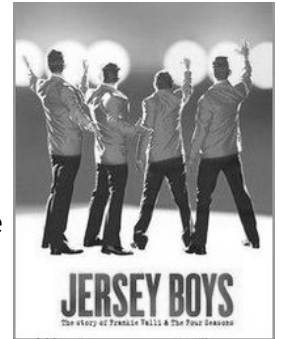

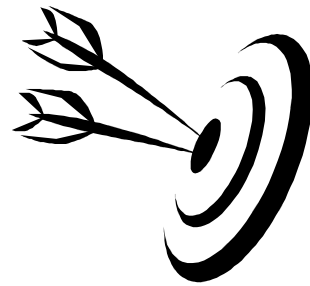
YOUTH ARCHERY CLASSES

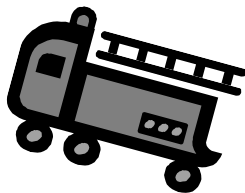

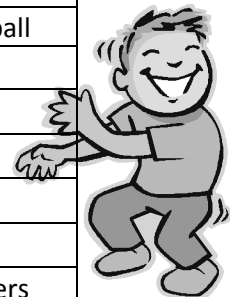
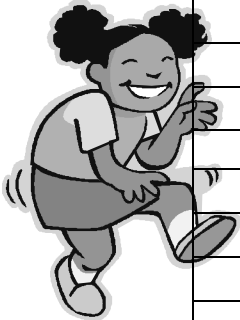


YOUTH ACTIVITY NIGHTS

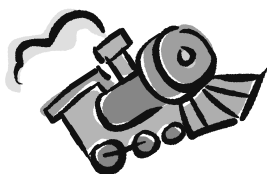

If you would like to make a donation, just stop by Project Share located in the basement of the Recreation Center. They are open from 9 to 3, Monday through Friday.

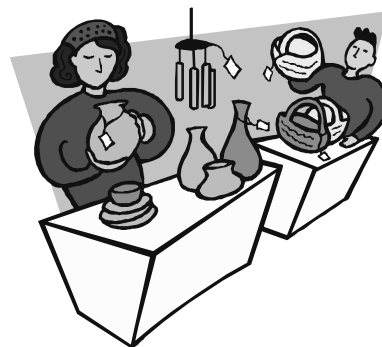

Children from 6 years old to 10 years old: Saturdays from 9am -10am running 10/15-11/19

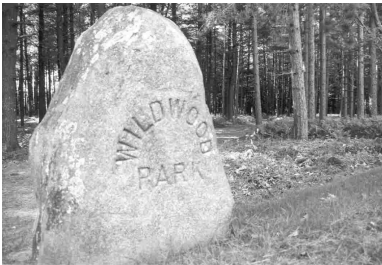

Ladies' Wildwood Park

A 15.4 acre wooded park

The park was created in 1890 when a stately grove of trees was threatened by development. Unfortunately the hurricane of 1938 leveled most of the original grove. The City replanted with red pines and a few huge white pines are all that remain from the original woods. The park is mostly flat and crisscrossed with trails.

To get there: The park is located at the intersection of Park Avenue and Arch Street. Parking is available in Wheelock Park across Park Ave.

Dinsmoor Woods

A border strip of woodland along Maple Ave

In 1928 Mary Dinsmoor gave the city 13 acres of forest approximately 50 feet back from either side of Maple Avenue. Soon after the Faulkner and Colony firm added 8 acres to the park. The 1938 Hurricane took down most of the tall trees and the City replanted with red pines. In the spring watch for lady slippers in bloom and the larger white pines which pre-date 1938.

To get there: Go north on Court Street about one and 1/2 miles to Maple Avenue. Turn left onto Maple Avenue. Dinsmoor Woods is along the sides near Jonathan Daniels Elementary School.



Hickey—Desilets Park



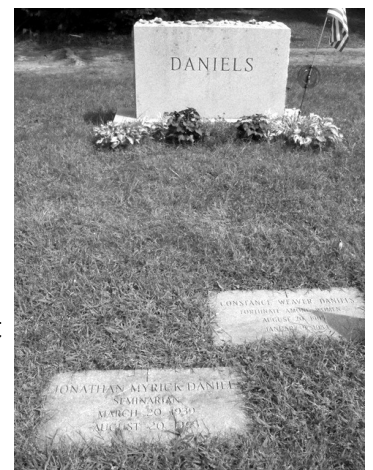
A tiny park in a bend of the Ashuelot River at the intersection of island and Winchester Streets. It was first established in the mid-1800's and called the "Ashuelot Park", but was renamed in the late 1930's in honor of Fred Hickey and Leo Desilets, Co. G, 103rd US Infantry, two World War I veterans who were killed in Chateau Thierry France.

Facilities: Park benches and ornamental trees and shrubs.

Monadnock View Cemetery

The newest of Keene's Cemeteries, Monadnock View is a park-style cemetery with a newly opened cremation section. The cemetery is the resting place of Jonathan Daniels, American martyr and inspiration. Fifty-plus years ago, he answered the call of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., to go to Lowndes County, Alabama, to gain voting rights and basic human dignities for all people. It was there he lost his life in defense of a young African-American teenager who had been demonstrating with him.

To get there: The cemetery is located at 521 Park Avenue.
